

My Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In the Gospel according to Mark, Chapter 16:1-7:

When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary, the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go and anoint him. Very early when the sun had risen,

On the first day of the week, they came to the tomb.

They were saying to one another, "Who will roll back the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?"

When they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled back; it was very large. On entering the tomb they saw a young man, sitting on the right side, clothed in a white robe, and they were utterly amazed.

He said to them, "Do not be amazed! You seek Jesus of Nazareth, the crucified. He has been raised; he is not here.

Behold the place where they laid him. But go and tell his disciples and Peter,

'He is going before you to Galilee;

There you will see him, as he told you." "

Mark begins "When the sabbath was over, namely the Jewish Sabbath. Now we enter a new era, the Christian era where our

Sabbath is celebrated on Sunday, the day Jesus rose from the dead.

Jesus' close friend, Mary Magdalene, Mary, the mother of James (who is Jesus' aunt), and Salome bought spices to anoint Jesus for burial. "Very early on the first day of the week when the sun has risen, they came to the tomb." On the way, they were discussing, "Who will roll back the stone for us at the entrance of the tomb? When they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled back; it was very large."

On entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting on the right side. (The right side is the positive side), clothed in a white robe (the robe of joy and celebration). They were utterly amazed. He said to them, "Do not be amazed! You seek Jesus of Nazareth, the crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Behold the place where they laid him (because he was dead). But go and tell his disciples and Peter (their head), "He is going before you to Galilee;

There you will see him, as he told you."

Now comes the period of remembrance, that he would be judged by the scribes, the chief priests and the Pharisees and be put to death. "But I will rise again on the third day."

It is normal for us to live a life of so-called normalcy, according to our experiences of everyday life, where the stones of our disbelief are very large, where life ends at death especially death by crucifixion. But Jesus calls us to a life of possibilities, that death isn't the end of the story if you believe in Christ. It is almost the beginning. Our life is a preparation for life eternal, eternal joy. "He is going before you to Galilee", the favorite place for Christ by the seashore. He is beginning life anew. That is where He is inviting us today, to the place where life begins again.

Forget the huge stones of tombs. Come to new life in Christ, then go out and proclaim His marvelous everyday phase, "Christ has died. Christ has risen. Christ will come again." Praise God. Happy Easter, Happy New Life in Christ!!
