# HOW TO MAKE A GOOD CONFESSION

# **EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE**

In order to make a good Confession, you need to make an examination of conscience first. Recall the sins you have committed since your Baptism or your last Confession, whichever is most recent.

# Have I violated the Ten Commandments?

1. <u>I AM the Lord your GOD; you shall not have other</u> gods before ME.

Do I love with all my heart the Lord who loves me and cares for me? Do I seek His presence, pray daily, and trust in Him, or have I failed to place Him first, or even betrayed Him through occult practices?

2. <u>You shall not take the name of the Lord your GOD</u> in vain.

Do I revere God's name, or have I taken it lightly, carelessly, or blasphemously, even wishing evil on others? Have I receive Him worthily in Holy Communion, or did I receive Him in a state of mortal sin? (Mortal sin: grave matter, full knowledge, and full consent of the will)

3. <u>Remember to keep holy the Sabbath day.</u> Do I worship the Lord by taking part in Mass on Sunday and Holy Days, or have I been indifferent to the Eucharist, to Christ's redeeming love, preferring earthly goods for my family and self by deliberately missing Mass on a Sunday or Holy Days of Obligation? Is Sunday my day of rest?

# 4. Honor your father and your mother.

Have I loved, respected, and obeyed my parents who gave me life? Do I care for them when they are in need or in old age? Do I forgive them when they are at fault? In difficulties, am I patient with them?

# 5. You shall not kill.

Have I loved my neighbor, or have I physically harmed or hastened the death of another through violence, abortion, euthanasia, drugs, hatred, the morning-after pill, or abuse? Have I practiced ways of life that are harmful to my family and self – spiritually and physically? Do I eat or drink immoderately?

# 6. and 9. <u>You shall not commit adultery; you shall not</u> covet your neighbor's wife.

Have I been pure and holy in thoughts, words, and actions, or have I been unfaithful to my spouse or desirous on another? Have I been sexually active outside of marriage, or with another of the same sex? Have I indulged in pornography, masturbation, contraception, and other sexual sins? Have I acted against my conscience and led others into sexual sin?


To defend these innocent children and to speak and act on their behalf takes courage. Perhaps family and friends may not like our pro-life stance. Perhaps we may lose business. We all know people who have had an abortion so perhaps we do not want to offend a relative or loved one. It is all too easy to make excuses or make calculations in our minds and hearts, which often results in paralyzed inaction and apathy.

We are always told of reasons why we cannot speak up against abortion. If the priest speaks in Church, he will be rebuked by some who will try to argue it's too political; if we speak in the political arena, we are told it's too religious. If we speak in the media, we are told it's too disturbing; in our schools and colleges, it's too disruptive. On the public streets, it's too distressing for children; in the business world it's too 'controversial, in the family it's too divisive, and in social settings, it's too impolite or politically incorrect.

So, if abortion is plainly wrong and inhumane (which it most definitely is), how do we do what is right and where do we go to say so? The unambiguous answer is that we must stop looking for a risk-free place to fight abortion, and have the courage to speak up in all these arenas!

Let's stop counting the cost to ourselves if we speak up and start counting the cost to the innocent children, if we remain silent.
