Making Advent a Special Time in Your Family

Advent starts next Sunday, November 27th. If you have never made Advent a special time for your Family, it is not too late to start this year. Advent is a prime opportunity for engaging kids in their faith. Using an Advent wreath in our homes, for example, resonates with children—probably since it allows them to handle matches and blow out candles! As Christmas approaches, we can also use the festive atmosphere, which has been hijacked by materialism and sentimentality, to underscore what we are *really* preparing for.

Advent has a twofold character:

- as a season to prepare for Christmas when Christ's first coming to us is remembered;

- as a season when that remembrance directs the mind and heart to await Christ's Second Coming at the end of time.

During Advent... talk to your Family about how you are doing in attending to your spiritual life as a Family. Recommit yourselves to praying daily, reading Scripture, and staying faithful to God's commandments. Pray together that through this Advent season your Family will be more prepared to receive Jesus when He comes again.

Prayers for Lighting the Advent Wreath Candles

[It is easy to purchase an inexpensive Advent wreath. A wide variety of Advent wreaths can be purchased online.

To use your Advent wreath, put it in a prominent place during the four weeks of Advent, light a new candle every Sunday, and pray the following prayers.]

First Week: (light one purple candle) All-powerful God, increase our strength of will for doing good that Christ may find an eager welcome at His coming and call us to His side in the kingdom of heaven, where He lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, God, forever and ever. ~AMEN.

Second Week: (light two purple candles) God of power and mercy, open our hearts in welcome. Remove the things that hinder us from receiving Christ with joy so that we may share His wisdom and become one with Him when He comes in glory, for He lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, God, forever and ever. ~AMEN.

Third Week: (light two purple and one rose candle) Lord God, may we, Your people, who look forward to the birthday of Christ experience the joy of salvation and celebrate that feast with love and thanksgiving. We ask this through Christ our Lord. ~AMEN.

Fourth Week: (light all four candles) Father, allpowerful God, Your eternal Word took flesh on our earth when the Virgin Mary placed her life at the service of Your plan. Lift our minds in watchful hope to hear the voice which announces His glory and open our minds to receive the Spirit who prepares us for His coming. We ask this through Christ our Lord. ~AMEN.



The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick will be administered on Thursday, December 8, at 10:00 am Mass. This Sacrament is NOT just for the dying. The Sacrament can be received more than once over the course of an illness. The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given to those who are seriously ill by anointing them on the forehead and hands with duly blessed oil with the words: "Through this holy anointing may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit. May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1513). After first and second verse of this special prayer the Penitent answers: Amen.
